## Fr Ben's Thoughts for April

This month I'd like to share with you a reflection that a member of our church sent on to me. It arrived in my email box in quite a timely manner, when I had been praying for God to send me some guidance. As is almost always the case, that guidance came through a person, just when I needed it – God's timing is always perfect. Perhaps as you read this, it will be the perfect time for you to read it too.

It was a piece found on Facebook, and appeared on a blog by Ken Gray. The Facebook post said.

"I visited Matthew, the owner of Lucy's Flour Shop a little while back. As I nibbled on an enormous chocolate chip cookie I began to tell him a story.

A few years back on a bitterly cold December evening, there was a visitation at the funeral home across the street from his bakery. The people, bundled up in coats, scarves, and blankets were lined up around the building waiting to hug the family of the deceased. Seemingly out of nowhere, a man showed up and began giving away hot coffee to the people outside. People who entered the funeral home with coffee in their hands whispered of a mysterious man handing out free coffee, and how much they appreciated it.

I looked at Matthew and said, "I have a suspicion that you were that man. Is that right?"

Matthew very humbly replied, "Yes, I felt so bad for them and wanted to do something, but all I could do was make coffee, so I made coffee." I responded that he blessed so many people that night by helping them warm up and by showing there's good in the world. He added a positive note to a devastating situation.

I paused, then added, "That visitation was for my sixteen-year-old son. Thank you for being so kind."

Ken Gray remarked that we can sometimes feel as if we have no power to make any difference to our world or to any situation. And yet we can do *something*, however small, that can make a huge difference to the lives of others. We'd all like to be able to fix our world, with all it's troubles and disasters. But if each of us were able just play our part, to 'make

coffee' in our community, in our nation, in our world, then our lives would look and feel so different.



## From a Gardeners Notebook, April 2024

It seems to be quite correct to say our weather is defiantly changing, with endless rain and very little frost in the mornings pear trees and apple trees have not had enough frost, for their germination and good growth.

The Hornbeam, I planted in July 2006, when we first moved to Great Barton has developed well providing much wanted shade in our back garden. There were no little birds in our garden when we arrived, but constantly filling feeders has helped a great deal. A very special treat in March 2007 was a flock of some 2,000 Golden Plovers, which we reported to the Suffolk Wild Trust.

For our novice gardeners I'd like to suggest that they observe the seasons with interest and note when plants and trees flower and so on. A tree paeony will take one week from bud to flower, if the weather is warm. Last month I suggested looking out for second hand tools; this month look for books

Has anyone had a failure with geranium seed this year? I have met one other person who like myself has had no joy.

How is your greenhouse? I hope you have given it a good clean this will make such a difference to the light for your plants.

**Prompt Points: time to sow runner beans in pots. There are many shrubs to prune in April as in March, here are just three.** 

- a) Forsythia, flower shoots only, do not hack!
- b) Tree paeony dead branches
- c) Perowskia Russian sage. Just above the ground level.
- d) Lastly, look out for plant sales, they start this month.

Listen for the cuckoo you might just get lucky. With Easter now behind us may I wish you all, happiness and pleasure this season.

is trying to make sense out of the senseless.

I have always loved my birthday. It just makes me happy: can't help it, can't explain it.

But 80 Years Old? How did that happen? My Grandparents, all 4 of them, and my parents, just 2 of them, did not make 80 years. And for a lot of my life, they were OLD. I don't, at least on a good day, feel as old as my Grandparents looked.

The time just rushes past, it seems. It is only when I think of all the things that have happened to me, where I've been, the people I have known, that I can understand the passage of time.

For instance, it is 53 years since the Scoles family came to live in Great Barton. I have lived here more than half of my life. Yet I remember my early life vividly, and I can never get away with claiming to be Britishborn because my accent gives me away almost immediately.

I don't mind being 80 - the alternative is not too good, after all. I am just amazed. I was amazed when I turned 50, too. At that time, I wrote a poem about it.

I wrote that when one is young, the lifegoal is often to be Healthy, Wealthy, and Wise. I was evaluating that goal from my half-century achievement. My summation of my life then still holds firm today:

> "At 50 (read 80), I am lucky to be Healthy. If counted in family and friends, I am Wealthy. But when, O Lord, when will I be Wise?"



While St Nicholas Hospice continues to celebrate its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Nicky's Way reached its 25<sup>th</sup>

anniversary in February. To mark this milestone, St Peter's presented its cheque and, to thank you for all your support, we share a photo and a shortened version of their account of our visit.



Thousands are raised for child bereavement service! Thousands of pounds have been raised to help support a local hospice's bereavement service for children. St Nicholas St Peter's Church in Thurston has handed over £4,106 to St lospice Care Nicholas Hospice Care, and the funds will be used to support

their Nicky's Way service, which helps children and young

### people facing grief.

Last year, the church ran its initiative 'By the Young for the Young,' which aimed to give youngsters the chance to have experiences they had missed out on mainly due to the pandemic, and they decided to raise some money for a good cause, too. To raise funds, the church organised several activities, including concerts, workshops and displays involving students from local schools, St Martin's Voices, The Voice Squad, a family walkathon and online auction, which saw more than 40 local businesses kindly provide lots. A family who received support from Nicky's Way, who had a special festive-themed trip to Melford Hall, enjoyed one such auction lot.

Vicky Butler's children were supported by Nicky's Way following the death of Vicky's brother and their nanny. Vicky said: "We were very thankful for the gift to go and have the day together to make some happy memories, and we really appreciate everything that Nicky's Way has done and is doing to support my children."

George Chilvers, the hospice's community fundraising manager, said: "We are really grateful to everyone at St Peter's Church for all of their support. To have raised more than £4,000 is fantastic, and I know this money will make a big difference to our Nicky's Way service and the children it supports.
